THE WHITE HOUSE LIBRARY is a reference and recreational library for the use of the President, his family, and official staff. It is intended to contain books which best represent the history and culture of the United States, works most essential for an understanding of our national experience.

The collection has to be strictly limited because the attractive library on the ground floor of the White House has shelf space for only twenty-five hundred volumes. Authors, with a few exceptions, are citizens of the United States; fiction and poetry by deceased writers only have been included.

Mrs. John F. Kennedy, on May 10, 1962, invited me to collect the books for this library. Previous to this date the reference department of the Library of Congress had reduced to a workable size their volume published in 1960, A Guide to the Study of the United States of Arnerica. This list was mimeographed and for a number of months worked over by a committee composed of Mr. Lyman H. Butterfield, Mr. Julian P. Boyd, and Mr. Arthur M. Schleinger, Jr., with criticisms and suggestions from many of their scholarly colleagues across the country.

The final list was put into shape in my office and published in The New York Times on August 16, 1963. Some seventy per cent of the books were primarily the gift of individuals from all over the country, university presses, commercial publishers, the American Booksellers' Association, and foundations; the remainder were purchased with funds given to the White House Historical Association by many generous donors.

Through Mr. Rutherford B. Rogers, formerly Chief Assistant Librarian of Congress, and later Mr. David C. Mearns, much of the cataloguing and other technical work of setting up the library and preparing this list was efficiently accomplished by the staff of our national library. Mr. James R. Ketchum, Curator of the White House, and his staff of attractive ladies have been helpful at all times, especially in receiving and acknowledging the gift of all the volumes.


This short-title list is primarily the original list as published in *The New York Times*. The library will be kept up to date in the future by the addition of important new publications.
